Chairman's Annual Report for Year ending 30 June 2018

This year has been one of significant activity and growth for the Trust. It continues to be a vital community organisation, locally within the Kaipatiki Local Board boundary and beyond. Several Local Board and Council staff from other Auckland areas continue to visit the Trust offices and shown interest in the work that is carried out within Kaipatiki.

The Trust acknowledges the significant contribution and support from the Local Board both elected representatives and officials. Without their support we would not be able to produce the ongoing achievements so important to our community. We want to acknowledge the interest that Board Chair, John Gillon shows in our activities, his advice support is important to us. We wish to also acknowledge the support of the Lion Foundation, Birkenhead Licensing Trust, The Ministry of Social Development, the Birkenhead RSA, and the NZ Lottery Board who contribute to the many projects that we carry out. We continue to be able to contribute to the revitalisation project being undertaken in Northcote central and are looking forward sharing our learning's and local knowledge in this major redevelopment.

One of the new developments of the Trust was the advice and support given to the partial refurbishment and revitalising of the Northcote Citizens Centre and amenities. This centre and its ancillary facilities contribute to the overall wellbeing of the Northcote area.

In all projects we are able to measure the effectiveness and the outcomes to ensure we are performing for the benefit of our community. A good example of this is the Sustainable Neighbourhood initiative, the aim of which is to have minimal waste within the urban housing areas. This initiative continues to gain momentum and will be beneficial to local residents. The flow on includes park restoration and the involvement by residents in the programme giving them ownership of their endeavours.

The Summer and Winter Fun programmes outcomes are good examples of the success of these enduring activities which involve thousands of children and adults especially during the summertime.

With the benefit of creative tools that continue to evolve over the years we are able to grow the learning's of children and I believe give them an awareness that will live with them forever.

We are very pleased with the Jobs for Youth Initiative that is being undertaken by the Trust. This programme is bringing together the desires of youth and matching to potential or existing job vacancies. The use of IT tools is assisting in this project and will help identify the matching of jobs to skill and training to make the young individual more successful in both securing and maintaining employment.

The above examples are representative of the work undertaken. There is many more that our residents participate in and demonstrate the diversity of the Kaipatiki area.

I would like to thank our Staff, Jill Nerheny for her tireless enthusiasm in her innovation that never ends, Michelle Whiu, for her diversity and dedication to the trust aims, including the supervision of the upgrade to the Northcote hall, Sonia Nerheny for her dedication to the local youth, and our other staff, including contractors, who have specific roles in our community endeavours.
